7 Minute HIIT Workout for Kids

- 7-Minute HIIT Workout for Kids**
Set an interval timer and complete each animal movement for 45 seconds, with 15 seconds of rest in between. Do as many as you can!
- FROG JUMPS**
Hop, hop, back and forth like a frog.
 - BEAR WALK**
Hands & feet on the floor, hips high - walk left and right.
 - GORILLA SHUFFLE**
Sink into a low crouched squat, with hands on the floor, shuffle around the room.
 - STARFISH JUMPS**
Jumping jacks as fast as you can, with arms and legs spread wide.
 - CHEETAH RUN**
Run in place, as FAST as you can! Just like the fastest animal in the Sahara.
 - CRAB CRAWL**
Sit and place your palms flat on the floor behind you near your hips. Lift up off the ground and crawl.
 - ELEPHANT STOMPS**
March in place lifting your knees as high as you can and stomping the ground as hard as you can!

Emotional Regulation is the ability to effectively manage and respond to an emotional experience. People unconsciously use emotion regulation strategies to cope with difficult situations many times throughout each day. However we often witness our children experience dysregulation as meltdowns, tantrums or difficult behaviors when they aren't able to diffuse their negative emotions.

Meltdowns

- Can begin as a tantrum and grow when control is lost
- Occurs when feeling overwhelmed
- Limited to no control while happening
- Can result in complete shutdown or withdrawal
- Occurs with or without an audience

Tantrums

- Goal Oriented
- Express want or need
- Begin 12-24 months up to age 3
- Some control maintained
- Resolve once able to “use words”
- Usually has an audience

How to tell the Difference

First determine the underlying cause. Is it goal-oriented? What is the child trying to say? Does it subside when you remove your attention? Does distraction reduce it?

If you can answer “yes” to all these, you’re witnessing a tantrum.

If it’s a meltdown, distraction or attention does not lessen it. Talking or picking child up might cause screaming or crying to increase.

Calming & Coping Strategies



Preparing children to better manage their own tantrums and meltdowns involves teaching them to recognize, name, and verbally express their feelings. Use of calming strategies and then providing opportunities when they are calm to practice them provides acceptable alternatives to screaming and physical aggression.



Ways to support your child

Talk with your child and share facts they can understand.

Let them know it’s ok if they feel upset. Share with them how you deal with your own stress so that they can learn to cope from you.

Try to keep up with regular routines. If schools are closed, create a schedule for learning with fun activities and relaxing time.

Need help? Know someone who does? If you or someone you care about, are feeling overwhelmed with emotions like sadness, depression or anxiety, or feel as if you want to harm yourself or others please reach out for help.
