PROGRAM REPORT

Program: ICF

Every 2 years, all residential staff need to be recertified in the Crisis Prevention Interventions (CPI) we use when working with individuals who are upset or angry. This course also teaches personal safety techniques if individuals become physically aggressive. For this refresher course, the focus was on a section for Setting Effective Limits. This is a section of the course that is most applicable to staff in the residences. In order to accommodate the 24/7 schedules of staff, 4 training sessions were held over 3 days, allowing staff from all 3 shifts to attend.

A number of residents were able to spend Thanksgiving with their families. For those who remained on grounds, a traditional thanksgiving meal was prepared by staff—Turkey, stuffing, sweet potato casserole, green bean casserole, and assorted pies for dessert. We also had 6 residents and 2 staff attend a Thanksgiving dinner at the Mayfield Church.

We had 4 residents participate in the Art class held at the administration building and 2 residents participate in Bingo.

Outings continue to occur on a regular basis. In November, 15 of 24 residents were able to access the community a total of 41 times. In addition to the regular shopping trips (7) that occur frequently, other trips included: Drug Mart, Walmart, Giant Eagle, out for Pizza.
