Activity Highlights:

We have trained most of the full time members of the ICF staff to drive the light transit vans. This will enable staff to use the vans with the wheelchair capabilities to transport clients to various community activities. In the near future, we will train substitute ICF staff.

We are currently using numerous providers to provide transportation services for individuals working in the community.

Our Lady of the Wayside (OLW) is currently the main provider. They provide services for 25 of our individuals. OLW has provided 1,157 trips since June 2016. They billed \$22,792.90 to the Medicaid waivers with the cost of fuel and vehicle repairs they are in they are in a deficit of \$4,461.53. The main reason for the deficit is the distance individuals must travel to get to their place of employment. Many individuals work out of county.

Financial

The First Quarter Compilation report for 2016 is in your board packet. The Second Quarter Compilation report should be done next week and I will send it out to you upon receipt from our Accountant. Pulling out just one set of figures you see that our residents pay close to 71% of their rent while the county pays 29% of the rent, this is misleading in that the 71% includes money paid by the Geauga Metropolitan Housing Authority, GMHA, and is not paid by the resident. We have 31 residents enrolled in the GMHA voucher system and each month receives \$7,240 in subsidies for those 31 residents. Taking that out you would find that the residents pay closer to 52% of their rent themselves and are subsidized close to 48%.

Grant Seeking/Fundraising:

We should now have all the costs of the golf outing accumulated and be able to tell the tale of what the profit should be, I will present the motion for the payment to the levy committee at next month's meeting after I confirm everything.

We are finally buying a building that will be of multiple uses for us. The building has a commercial waste water treatment plant that will mean we can move 2 individuals into the building who have a tendency to use more water than what is considered normal use, we will be able to salvage the house that they are in by doing some work on the flooded septic leech field and move in four individuals who need a wheelchair accessible home, and then take part of the new property and add two much needed in-law suits that will be used for people who are almost ready to move into their own apartments.

Property Management:

We have a number of new residents coming to live in our homes filling vacancies that we have had for a while. We will have Evergreen filled again by the middle of October.

Our laborer has been of great help to us power spraying houses and decks and staining those that needed touching up. Two of the homes are finished that needed new siding.

Miscellaneous:

The person in-charge of funding the homes we buy through State of Ohio Capital Grants came and visited us in August. This is the first time anyone from the state has come to look at what the state has helped us buy or for what matters, any county in the state since the state began funding the purchase of homes. We visited 6 houses in the day and I think he was impressed. His report is attached to the Board Packet and I am willing to answer any questions you may have about it.
